Lady Bulldog basketball pre-season play got started with their own preview tournament. The Lady Dogs opened the tournament with an easy win over the Gallatin County Hawks, 85-47.

A strong first half put the Dogs out front to stay. Ricki DeArmon opened the game with a pair of jumpshots and led the rest of the game. The Bulldogs went to the locker room with a 43-25 advantage. The second half was much like the first, and Gallatin County had absolutely no chance of a comeback.
