Mrs. Marcy Bebout is the new math teacher at HHS. She attended Carrier Mills High School, SIC, and SIU graduating from all three

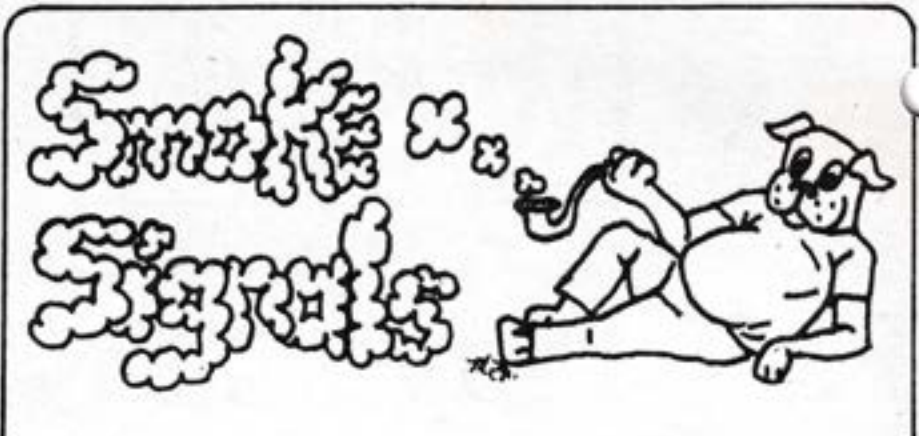


with honors. "Mathematics can be fascinating." says Mrs. Bebout and she would like to get this across to her students.

Our athletic record is expected to improve because of this program.

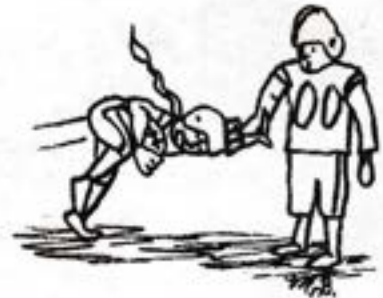
Puffs Win
